

Brett Fusco is the Manager of Long-Range Planning at the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, where he works with the commission's planning partners, stakeholders, and the public to set the region's vision for growth and development. He was instrumental in forming the Futures Group, an interdisciplinary working stakeholder expert group that uses exploratory scenario planning to better understand how different trends and forces are shaping Greater Philadelphia's future. He has also developed an interactive web-based scenario tool: Choices & Voices. He works with DVRPC's planning partners on long-range financial plans for the region's transportation infrastructure that use performance-based planning, asset management, and mode-neutral project evaluation criteria. He's (co)authored a variety of key policy papers, such as *Networking Transportation the Connections* (2035, 2040, and 2045) series of long-range plans, and *DVRPC's Options for Filling the Region's Funding Gap*.
